Mayor	Mayor Densmore	Report & Announcements	Report	Mayor Densmore requested a list of Village EMS responses from Chief Timmers. Of the 66 runs included on the list were 36 runs that were not from Golf Manor. Mayor Densmore is concerned

- that the number of runs being provided to both this body and the Fire District is not accurate.
- County Health Commissioner Kesterman has advised County residents who've received both Pfizer vaccinations that they are now eligible for a booster if they are over the age of 65, have certain pre-existing medical conditions, or are employed in a high exposure profession.
- Duke Energy is offering a rental, mortgage, and utility assistance program. Details of the program were mailed to every Village resident. To be eligible for the mortgage program, the mortgage holder must have an income at or below 150% of the regional income average and be in danger of delinquency or default on their mortgage.
- The latest edition of the Village newsletter was shared earlier
 this month. The newsletter costs \$60 to print, and Mayor
 Densmore has personally been printing them himself. Mayor
 Densmore thanks all the volunteers who have helped spread
 the newsletter to their neighbors. There is a need for additional
 volunteers. If interested in helping please contact Ms. Snyder.
- The Village welcomed the 513 Relief Bus earlier this month.
 Mayor Densmore attended the event and was pleased to see a steady flow of residents engaging with the service. The relief bus offered a wide range of information, programs, and services.
- Mayor Densmore is requesting volunteers to serve on the Village Park Board and the Human Rights Commission. Mayor Densmore has received several calls from individuals interested. Mayor Densmore and Administration are working in concert to determine the process for making selections to both bodies.
- There will be an interfaith vigil to end the death penalty at Xavier University. Currently, there is a bipartisan bill before the State Legislature that would eliminate the death penalty in Ohio. The Bill is sponsored by Rep. Jean Schmidt and Senator Cecil Thomas. If interested in learning more or attending the vigil please contact Mayor Densmore.
- Mayor Densmore is requesting all Council members identify the most important issues facing the Village over the next 10 years as part of the Village's strategic planning process. Mayor Densmore is requesting that each member come to the meeting

Administration Project Updates: Vera Road Update – The new water main is being activated property by property. Curbs will start within the next two weeks. Projected project completion has moved out further to mid-November. Waste Collection Contract – Council is approving the new contract tonight which include weekly recycling pick-up as well as yard waste recycling for 8 weeks in the Fall and 4 weeks in the Spring. Playground Project – Council will be approving the contract this evening. The \$50,000 in COVID funding is being applied to this project. Strategic Plan – Preparing for the working session of Council for Wednesday, October 6 at 6:30 PM. Last day for voter registration in Ohio prior to the November 2 election is Monday, October 4. Fiscal Officer	Andy Lanser	Report		 For the month of August FY21, the Village had an adjusted bank balance of \$4,046,420.14. Of this amount \$3,967,613.52 can be found in the Village's primary checking account. The remaining balance rests in the several Law Enforcement accounts. For the month the Village spent \$332,000 and received \$760,258.60. The large deposit of receipts for the month is due to the Village receiving the second half property taxes. Of the \$760,248.60 received, \$470,000 were general fund receipts. The Village received \$73,000 in General Fund income tax receipts. Motion to accept report by Boettcher Second by Ms. Chaney

				 The 2019/20 Audit has been completed by Perry and Associates. Perry and Associates have distributed a draft report to Village Administration. The team at Perry and Associates have identified two findings in their report. The findings were financial reporting, and compliance. All findings are considered minor by Perry and Associates and have either already been resolved by Village Administration or will be shortly. Perry and Associates is also requiring a fund adjustment of approximately \$2,500 between two Village recycling funds. On balance, this audit was a significant improvement when compared to the previous.
