Subject: Police Department Monthly Report

Crime within the Village remains relatively low, with no significant crime trends or critical incidents to report at this time. We would like to remind residents that if you see something suspicious, no matter how big or small, please do not hesitate to report it. The best way to ensure an officer is dispatched promptly is to contact the Hamilton County Communications Center at 513-825-2280.

Thank you to everyone who attended Coffee and Conversations with the Golf Manor Police Chief and the Fire Chief of the Deer Park-Silverton Fire District on August 25, 2026. We truly enjoyed the opportunity to connect with those who stopped by and look forward to hosting another event in the near future.

The Police Department also recently held its first Police Town Hall. While attendance was limited to Mayor Densmore and Councilmember Chesser, we remain committed to holding these meetings quarterly as an opportunity to maintain an open line of communication between the Police Department and our residents, ensure community concerns are heard, and work cooperatively to address problems. More information will be shared soon regarding our next Town Hall, tentatively scheduled for November 18, 2026, at 6:00 PM.

We would also like to provide an update regarding a case that has received considerable media attention. On May 4, 2026, Golf Manor officers responded to 1863 Section Road, Yeshiva Lubavitch, regarding an individual yelling threatening and derogatory statements toward residents and members of the school.

Following a thorough investigation and outstanding work by Detective Shane Ward, Detective Jill Matthews, and Officer Michael Mullen, the Golf Manor Police Department arrested and charged Jackson Mettler with one count of Menacing and one count of Ethnic Intimidation.

Mettler subsequently pleaded guilty. The Court sentenced him to three days in jail, one year of probation, and a stay-away order from Yeshiva Lubavitch.
